### Bullying....Exactly What Is It?

At last night's School Council meeting we were looking over some data from 2018. We discussed the Parent Opinion Survey data and the section about bullying was raised for discussion. During this time the question was raised about whether parents and students had a understanding of what bullying was, and the difference between bullying and other social interactions that are sometimes not very pleasant. We see and hear a lot in the media about bullying but sometimes this is misrepresented. Bullying is the intentional and repeated hurtful behaviour over a period of time. This is different to other occasions where there maybe hurtful behaviour that occurs once and is not repeated.

We feel that it is important that our community understands the difference in these behaviours and the actions associated with them. Hurtful actions are dealt with regardless if they are bullying or once off occurrences, but we also need to be aware if they are repeated and intentional so that they can be tackled with that in mind.

We have included a graphic that may help understand the differences in behaviours.
