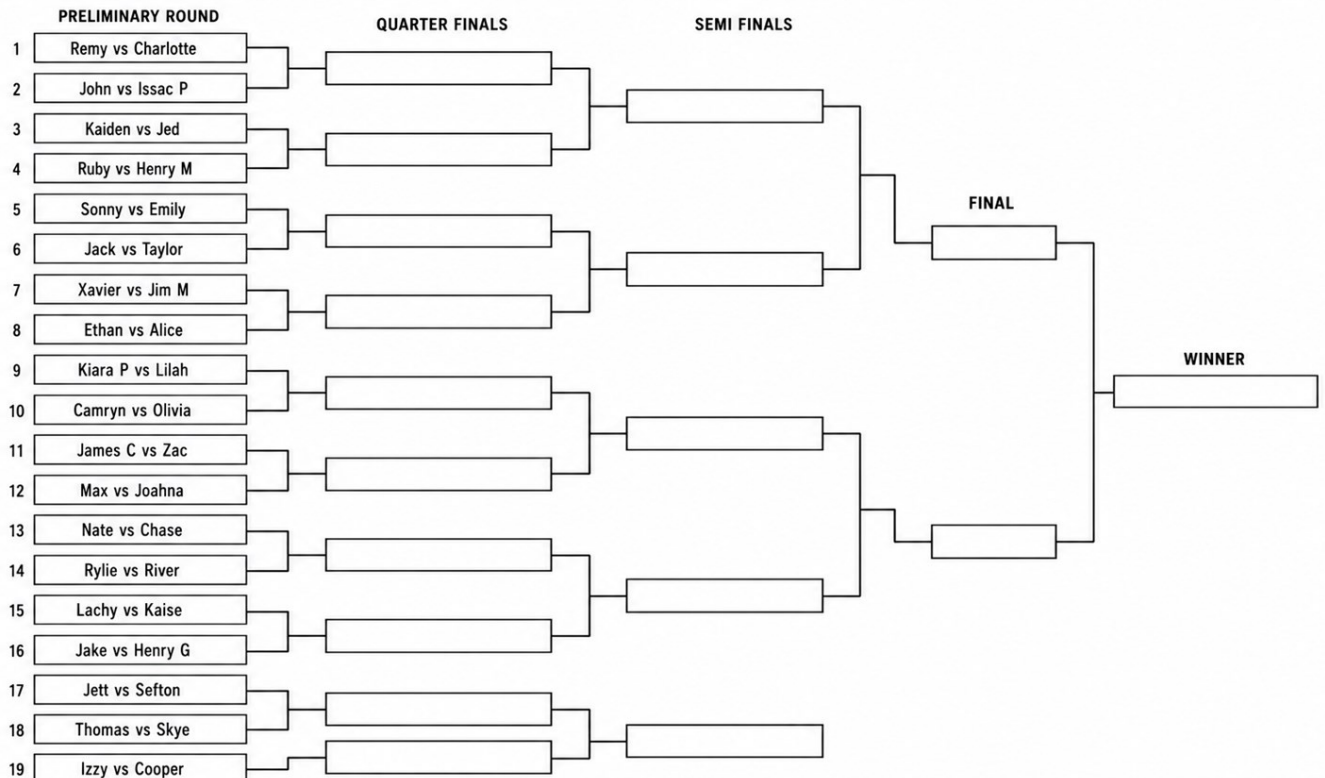
## Down Ball Tournament

The downside to the work being done on Friday is that the students will not be here to see it. We will record the action and show them on Monday.



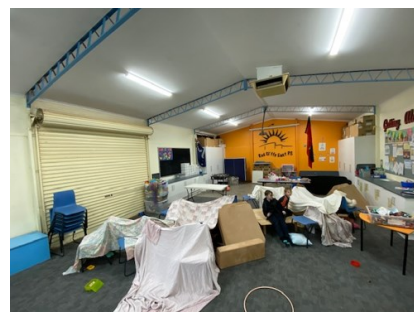
## After School Care
