If your child is absent from school we must have a note, phone call or you can also enter the reason directly onto COMPASS to explain the absence. This is required by the Department for our records.



Asthma And Anaphylaxis Plans

Recently the staff completed their asthma and anaphylaxis training that updates us on how to treat your child in the case of an asthma attach or anaphylactic reaction. It should give you peace of mind as a parent that the staff all know how to look after your child when they really need it.

What we need from the parents of these students are up to date treatment plans. We have a number of students with asthma and some students with anaphylaxis, but unfortunately their plans are not up to date. The plans, developed by your doctor, will guide us in treating your child in the case of an asthma attack or anaphylactic reaction. So please, make an appointment with your GP and update/create your treatment plans. Once complete, we need a copy at the office to be accessed by staff if required. Also, please ensure all asthma puffers and EpiPens are in date. We require these at school to be stored with the plans.

Whole School Review

Every 4 years our school (and all other government schools in Victoria) have a review of our practices, student results and overall function of the school. This process allows us to dive deep into how the school in functioning and allows us to set goals and targets for the next 4 years. As a school we understand the strengths and also the areas we need to work on. The review allows us to formalise this with the support of 2 challenge partners (educators/leaders from other schools), a reviewer appointed by the Department, our own school leaders, school council representative and representatives of the Department. It really is a thorough review.

The process has been going on for over a term now with many sets of data being analysed and interpreted, drawing conclusions and creating questions that need answering. All this work will be coupled with 3 days of school observation that will start next week. We will have all the stake holders on site observing classes as well as talking to students, teachers and parents.

After the process is complete, we will have a very clear indication of the direction for our school for the next 4 years. We will share this with our community when the dust settles on the process.

On the Thursday morning (20th July 8.45-9.30am) we are looking for 8-10 parents who would be interested in being a part of a parent focus group for the review. The reviewer will conduct the session and will be looking for parent perspectives about our school. What is working? What do you value? Where you think we could improve? If you would like to be a part of the group please let me know. We are setting a limit of 10 places as a large group does not work in this situation. Parent voice is a vital element of the review process.


