Today we had 2 cricket teams compete in the Southern Mallee T20 big blast cricket at Quandong Park.

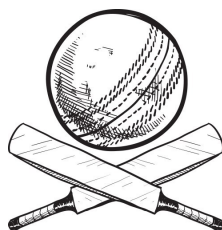
Each team had a mixture of inexperienced and semi experienced cricketers. Each team certainly 'had a crack'.
