If anyone is looking for painting or flooring, I would highly recommend these local businesses.

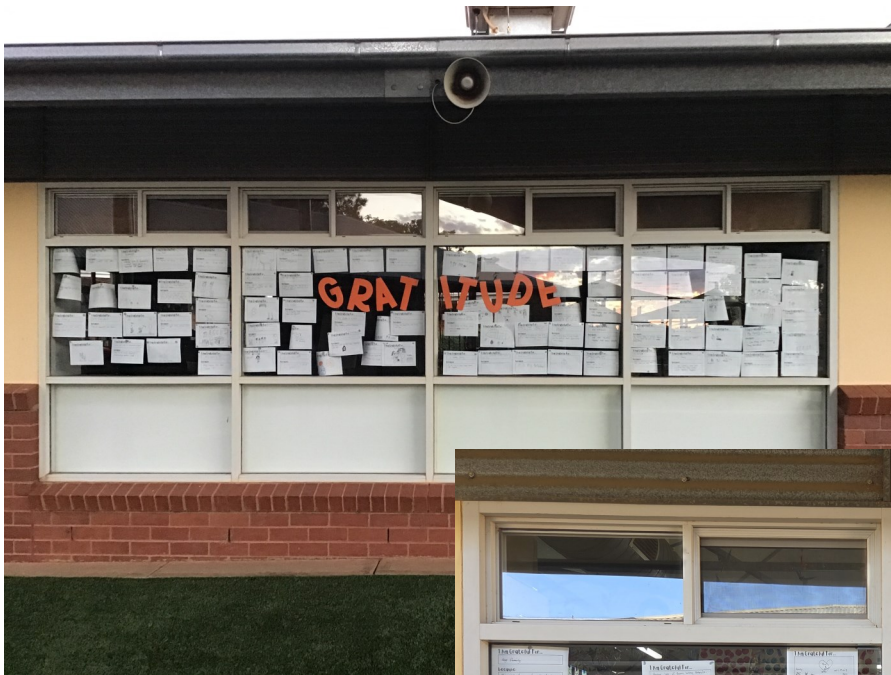
RSL Visit
