Student Progress Reports—Term 1

Today, student progress reports will be uploaded to COMPASS. Students and parents will receive feedback about how they are progressing with our Learning Attributes and The Resilience Project (TRP) learning. This helps to form a complete picture of your child's Learner and Social Capabilities.

The report has been completed by your child's class teacher.

Accompanying the teacher is also a student self reflection and goals.

Together these 2 pieces should give you a clear understanding of how your child is progressing.

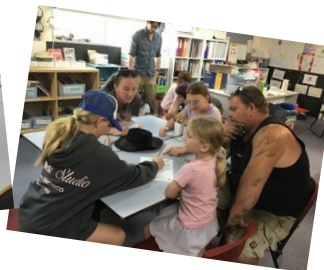
Resilience Project—Family Information Session
